*Programs

- National Shellfish Sanitation Program (NSSP)
- Barnegat Bay Sampling Initiative
- Non-Point Source (NPS) Pollution Studies and Microbial Source Tracking (MST)
- Continuous Real-time Water Quality Monitoring
- Ecosystem Monitoring: Ambient Nutrient Monitoring Program, National Coastal Condition Assessment (NCCA), and Ocean Benthic Index Development

*Why are we here?

- In 2018 The Port Republic Beach was closed for most of the summer due to high
 E. Coli levels at the beach. This never happened before.
- The City of Port Republic requested assistance from the DEP.
- This was referred to Marine Water Monitoring, we have a long history of performing microbial source tracking studies across the State.
- Show study results of bacteria source locations.
- Describe conditions observed in 2018.
- Discuss recommendations to rectify and alleviate bacterial pollution.

*MST Sampling Conducted

- We designed sampling at potential sources and sample prior to rain and during rain events.
- Sampling locations are added if needed.
- We have a laboratory to perform the standard bacteria tests and advanced tests to determine the sources, human, domestic animal and wildlife.
- Four storm water sampling everts were conducted in 2018.
- After sampling events meeting were held with the City.

*Results

- Some areas are routinely high for E. Coli.
- Advanced test shows a mix of wildlife, domestic animals, human
- 2018 was the wettest year on record for New Jersey, exceeded the average annual rainfall in September
- Water tables high, ground saturated
- Increase in runoff from rain events, potential impacts to old septic/cesspool systems.
- Sampled all the way from the Route 9 bridge down to Nacote Creek getting very high levels off the runoff from the ball field, and along the stream at Park Avenue.

*Recommendations

- Scheduled public meeting, help from the public is needed to solve pollution problems
- Need to test septic systems for issues and ensure proper pump out and maintenance. Atlantic County Health Department conducted dye testing of the septic systems at the School and Municipal Building (working properly)
- Find a solution to reduce the bird population at the beach and the field. Canada Goose-1.5 lbs./day (681 grams) at 128,000 fecal coliforms/gram, approx. 87,000,000 fecal coliforms/day.
- Ensure the clean up of dog waste. Average of all size dogs-0.5 lbs/day (227 grams), 23,000,000 fecal coliforms/gram, 5,221,000,000 fecal coliforms/day.
- No feeding wildlife
- Rake beach everyday and remove waste from beach area.

Comments:

Resident Joe Martin questioned the results for Mill Pond, Robert stated that the results for the pond came back perfect.

Council President Wessler stated that after the City had their meeting with the DEP that testing should be done for all the homes along the stream from Park Ave to Clarks Landing Rd, it would be the individual homeowner's responsibility to fix their septic if it is compromised, the City investigated grants for the homeowners, there is a grant depending on income levels. The city contracted with the USDA for geese control. The city attorney will draft a letter to residents to test their septic systems.

Councilwoman Bugdon stated the city is closing off the Environmental Park, due to people not picking up after their dogs.

Councilwoman Riegel questioned would dredging help the contamination problem, Robert Schuster from The NJDEP stated once they start the tidal monitoring they will have more information regarding if dredging would be helpful. Councilwoman Riegel

questioned was the wrong testing being done? Robert mentioned no they are just testing with different methods.

A comment was made regarding tributaries coming into Mill Pond. Robert stated that they all came back clean.
