The Planning Board recommends that the city attorney go over sections 160-6 and 160-55 to tighten it up. Specifically, if the tiny house is not mobile then the requirement is that they must go before the Planning Board; if it is mobile, then the requirement is that it can only be seasonal. Second, is the Route 610 bridge. There is information that a six foot bike lane and eight walking lane will be added. The Planning Board committee would like to set up a meeting with the County regarding proposed plans. Third, is the proposed motocross in Galloway Twp. which abuts the city's property – currently the gravelmine. Port Republic is concerned that a motocross in that area would affect the subdivision of the property, as well as, the residents in the area.

Route 9 signage

Ray Went Esq. advised that he spoke with his contact at the NJDOT and signage has been installed. He believes there have been nine to twelve signs installed.

Boundary Determination 201 Chestnut Neck Rd. Block 6 Lot 51

Matt Doran, City Engineer reviewed; the survey reveals that a portion of Chestnut Neck Road crosses over the property. His discussion with the County could not verify that an easement for the road could not be found.

NEW BUSINESS:

Atlantic City Electric Easement

Atlantic City Electric would like to cut back a portion of Pitney Road back thirty feet from the center line. Mike Fitzgerald, Esq. advised that the easement is broader than it needs to be. His recommendation is to revise the actual removal of trees from thirty feet to fifteen feet from the center line. Additionally, he recommends that they identify the trees to be removed and that only Council can give permission. Councilman Wessler stated that in addition to the trees he wants it clearly communicated that the City does not approve the installment of the steel poles.

PILOT (City Solicitor Ray Went)

Ray Went Esq. reported that the monies earmarked for Atlantic City was originally allocating 13.5% of the funds to the County which was meant to offset taxes to the county; the amount then went down to 10.5% and is now at zero. Port Republic may be only one of two municipalities in the county that may not be affected but, the County will be hit hard; 40 million dollars over the next ten years. The County wants to sue and challenge, in what is called the Declaratory Judgment Action; claiming that the PILOT is unconstitutional and otherwise invalid. He suggests that Port Republic support the County on the challenge.
