#### FROM THE DESK OF THE MAYOR...

Brrr—winter is upon us with snow, wind and freezing rain. We can see the light at the end of the tunnel with COVID-19, with vaccines that are on their way to the masses. We strongly support all the work and time invested to bring a halt to this world crisis.

Some major projects City Council is working on for the year are as follows:

- Begin a study of the Mill Pond Dam to investigate best practices available to us to manage water flow from Mill Pond.
- Investigate availability of grant monies to enable the City to dredge Nacote Creek from the Dam to the 610 Bridge.
- A new Historical Committee has been formed on City Council with the purpose of investigating and preserving the story of Port Republic's past for future generations to appreciate.
- A new City Council Marijuana Legislation Investigatory Committee has been formed to study the impact of recently legalized marijuana laws on the City.
- Road improvements will continue. This year portions of Pomona Avenue will be re-paved.
- We are continuing work with the State Police to enhance traffic safety and general public safety in town.
- Finally, but certainly not least the Mayor's Office and City Council will be reviewing all potential sources of revenue to the City with the idea of minimizing the tax strain on individual residents, but also attempting to stabilize financial reserves for the purpose of supporting our cherished Port School.

Our City has such a rich history. The earliest settlers in Southern New Jersey were the Lenni Lenape tribe and often were visited by the Nanticotes from Delaware. They were strong fishermen and reaped rewards from the sea, fishing for crab and shell fish. They named the creek that flows with the tide, Nacote Creek which means "peaceful home by moving water". The growth of Atlantic white cedars along the Mullica and Nacote Creek brought Dutch ship builders to the area. Where our town became an important part of early ship building on the historic east coast of New Jersey. This area still remains one of the worlds largest industries in the country with established Viking Yachts which are sent all over the world. In perspective our past will show our future.

All of the City's employees and those who serve us with contracts should be praised and praised often for a job well done. We are all in this together and together we can move forward. Stay warm, bundle up if the outdoors calls, and may GOD continue to bless us all, stay safe.



Wednesday, M a r c h 24, 2021 9:00am - 12:30pm 1:00 - 3:00 pm

To ensure your child's Kindergarten registration can be completed at your scheduled appointment, please be sure to have met all necessary requirements and have forms listed below:

#### Age Requirement:

Child MUST be 5 years old on or before October 1st of the school year for Kindergarten.

#### Certificates/Identification:

Proof of residency (tax bill, deed, lease), Valid Photo ID + 2 bills w/address

Original Birth Certificate – issued by the state or local Registrar of Vital Statistics, or for foreign born children, a report issued by the U.S. Consular Service.

Student Guardianship/Custody Papers: If applicable

#### Immunization Records (up to date):

including, DTaP-4 doses, with 1 dose after the  $4^{th}$  birthday, or any 5 doses, two doses of MMR, completed Hepatitis B vaccine series, Polio, Chickenpox (Varivax) vaccination.

#### Physical:

Verification from student's physician of physical within 365 days of the first day of school.
