As I am writing this we are in the midst of recovering from the 18" snow storm. I am so impressed by ALL of the people who are employed by our City. There was a plan in place that if someone needed an ambulance, there would be a plow in front of the ambulance clearing the way. Our road department stepped up and has received rave reviews from the County as the best cleared roads in all of Atlantic County.

As I am learning about all the workings of Port Republic, I have become aware that ten percent of our community members volunteer to do something to make everyone's lives a little bit better. We have about 30 volunteer firefighters who do so much more than put out fires. We have 11 volunteers that serve breakfast and lunch to our students at Port School on a rotating daily basis. There is the new Port School Education Foundation that is providing extra programming for the students and grants for the teachers. PTS is also an active group providing events for our students. There are also many volunteers that make the area around the church look polished and our recreation fields are funded and maintained by volunteers. And of course our City Council, Planning Board, and School Board members spend countless hours taking care of business.

We now have a newly formed Port Republic Heritage Society. We will be planning an additional celebration including a parade on Port Day to commemorate the founders of this beautiful place that we call home. # \*\* Type I / Type II School District Update \*\*

From Mayor Niki

In the General Election, November 2021, there was a question on the ballot determining if Port Republic should change from a Type I to a Type II School District. The question on the ballot was not consistent with the wording of the statute, and there was no interpretive statement. If the vote result was accepted, there would not have been a legal school board administering the workings on the school as of January 1st according to the School Board Solicitor.

Collectively, Solicitors of the School Board, the County, City of Port Republic, our Interim Mayor and Judge Savio met to determine the next step. The Judge agreed to invalidate the vote. The School Board Solicitor and the Port Republic City Solicitor are working together to properly word the question for the November 2022 General Election so voters will understand how this decision will impact our school and community.



The best part is they are learning skills and creativity while having fun. A subject that I was able to initiate through my work as an EMT for JFK EMS was the CPR/ First Aid/ Babysitting Certification for 6-8th graders which so far has produced 6 students with necessary life saving skills they might not have yet thought about obtaining. It is enrichment programs like this that take The Port Republic School Education Foundation to another level and ultimately enhance all those surrounding communities as well.

When I first thought of this my idea was donate per mile, however as planning occurred it was decided that per mile, per hour or any determinant that you as donors wanted to use to donate will be immensely appreciated.

# From the Mayor's Kitchen

I have always thought that the best way to teach children fractions is with baking. If you have children or grandchildren that could use a fun math lesson (by figuring out how many different ways to measure a cup), or if you just need a delicious snack, or want to treat a neighbor with something special, this recipe is for you.

# **Peanut Butter Chocolate Chunk Cookies**

1 cup (2 sticks) butter

1 cup peanut butter (smooth or chunky)

1 cup sugar

1 cup brown sugar

2 eggs

2 1/2 cups All Purpose Flour

1 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 cups chocolate chunks

Granulated sugar for rolling cookies

Preheat oven to 375

In an electric mixer, cream butter, peanut butter and sugars. Add the eggs and mix until creamy.

Blend the flour, baking powder, soda and salt together well. Add these dry ingredients to the butter mixture. Add the chocolate chunks and mix well. Cover dough and chill for an hour in the refrigerator to make the dough easier to handle.

Make 1 inch balls of dough and roll between the palms of your hands. Roll the shaped balls in granulated sugar and place 2 inches apart on a non stick or lightly greased cookie sheet. Dip a fork in the granulated sugar and make a criss cross pattern on the top of the cookie while you slightly flatten the cookie.

Bake for 10-12 minutes. Makes 4-5 dozen cookies.

# GUIDELINES

### **RESIDENTS ONLY - NO BUSINESSES!**

- 1. Determine if product is hazardous waste (see back).
- 2. Keep products in original container. Place items containing mercury in cardboard box or plastic bag.
- 3. Place items in a box or other container you don't need back. We'll use this to unload items from your vehicle.
- 4. Proof of Atlantic County residency is required. Please bring a driver's license, tax bill, or other document with you. You may bring another Atlantic County household's waste with you.

**Atlantic County Utilities Authority** 

Maximum quantity per household is 20 gallons and/or 200 lbs. dry weight. Individual item container sizes cannot exceed five gallons, and individual item containers will not be returned.

**Proof of residency** (tax bill, deed, lease), Valid Photo ID + 2 bills w/address **Original Birth Certificate** - issued by the state or local Registrar of Vital Statistics, or for foreign born children, a report issued by the U.S. Consular Service. **Student Guardianship/Custody Papers:** If applicable

## Immunization Records (up to date):

including, DTaP-4 doses, with 1 dose after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday, or any 5 doses, two doses of MMR, completed Hepatitis B vaccine series, Polio, Chickenpox (Varivax) vaccination.

# Physical:

Verification from student's physician of physical within 365 days of the first day of school.
