Fire and Ambulance:

Chief John Yochim reported that the Fire Department received a call to investigate a fence that was placed along Knowles Lane. Chief Yochim feels that Knowles Lane is now too narrow, and a fire truck would not fit with the fence at its current location. Councilmember Allgeyer added that this is a dangerous situation. Clerk Campellone added that Code Enforcement Officer Kevin Cain sent a letter to the property owner on Monday, April 11th giving the property owner 14-days to correct the code violation. If the code violation is not corrected within the allotted time, the city will take further action.

Board of School Estimates:

Mayor Giberson reported that soon they will be meeting regarding the L.E.A.P. Grant which is a grant they obtained to help them gather information for financial ways to make the school work. The school has hired a new interim superintendent who will start on July 1st.

Planning Board:

Council President Kozlowski reported that the Planning Board Meeting which was scheduled for Monday, April 11, 2022, was postponed due to not having a quorum.

Code Enforcement/Construction:

Mr. Haviland also thanked Council for once again having a port-a-potty placed along Park Avenue.

Scott Summerill, 114 Central Avenue, spoke to Council regarding a speeding issue on Central Avenue. He is concerned this is a public safety issue. He knows in the past there were speed signs and there were discussions of speed bumps. Council President Kozlowski explained that the residents must go to the State Police. At a minimum this creates a record which can help Council with further efforts to combat speeding issues throughout town. Council will place a solar speed sign along Central Avenue to help with the issue. Council Bugdon suggested that Mr. Summerill keep a record of times and days which are the most trouble so he can report that to the State Police.

Dam Update

Council President Kozlowski explained that they had a meeting on April 5th. The project is in process. The City is looking for Federal assistance. Congressman VanDrew's Office is looking forward to assisting us after they settle the Lenape Lake Dam Project.

Old Garage Update

Council President Kozlowski reported that this project is continuing to progress.

Storm Drain Update

Council President Kozlowski explained that this project is to divert the waters from across Main Street that end at the beach area. This has been suspected of being a primary source of beach pollution. Public Works Consultant Bill Montag feels this is a project which can be handled by our Public Works Department, rather than going out to bid. Engineer Matt Doran is in the process of receiving approval from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection. By handling this project internally, this will save the city a lot of money. The project will not be done until the Fall.

Council President Kozlowski shared that he spoke with Mr. Brandenberger from the Galloway Township EMT's. They will be more than happy to assist with the event, but they do have a training event the same day so the assistance will not be as great and they may have to leave if needed.

Firemen's Dinner – May 21st

Chief Yochim shared that they are preparing for over 800 people since they did sell out at their last dinner.

Community Day – June 18th

Mayor Giberson shared that the Fire Company will not be preparing food for this year's Community Day Event. They have arranged for five food trucks. The PTS is organizing a kick ball game. The Mott's Creek Pickers band will be playing. And the night will end with fireworks. The City's law firm and the Port Republic School Board's law firm have come together to sponsor the pony rides, so they will be free to the public. There will be a souvenir booklet like ones that have been done in the past. So far, they have sold close to \$2,000.00 worth of ads. She is partnering with Stockton to have it printed there. Stockton will be doing this at a very discounted rate. They have a class named Graphic Design for Partnering with Communities and they will be designing some of the ads as part of their class. The deadline for ads is May 1st. There will be a bike parade and dog parade on Community Day as well. Cedar Creek will be leading the parade and she is hoping to get bagpipes to finish the parade. The Fire Department will be in the parade as well as antique cars. Heritage Society would like to request that some historical items be displayed in a case in Council Chambers now that we no longer have court here. Councilmember Bugdon shared how nice this is all coming together.
