Swan Bay Gingerbread Cookies

Nothing says the Christmas season more than gingerbread. This is a 4th generation recipe from my family. It can be shared in 2 ways. The dry ingredients can be put in a Mason jar along with the recipe for the added wet ingredients and given as a gift, or you can make the cookies, frost and share.

3 1/2 cups flour

1 tsp baking powder

1 tsp baking soda

1 tsp cloves

1 tsp cinnamon

1 tsp allspice

1/4 tsp nutmeg

1/2 cup granulated sugar

3/4 cups brown sugar

(All of the above ingredients can be put in a 32 oz Mason jar with the following directions)

Beat together:

1 softened stick of butter

3/4 cup molasses

1 TBS vinegar

1 beaten egg

- -Add dry ingredients into the wet ingredients and mix well.
- -Cover dough and refrigerate for at least 1 hour.
- -Roll dough 1/4" thick and cut out with your favorite cookie cutters. Place on an ungreased cookie sheet and bake for 10-12 minutes in a 350 preheated oven.

Cream Cheese Frosting

1/4 cup butter (room temperature)

3 oz Cream Cheese (room temperature)

1 1/2 cup confectioners sugar

1/2 tsp vanilla

Beat together butter, cream cheese and vanilla. Add confectioners sugar. Beat until smooth.

We all celebrated the goodness of God in early 2021 when the \$270,000 for the purchase of the historic Port Church was supplied in just 23 days. Many of you participated in that miracle which returned the control of that historic building to our community!

Now, we need your help once again, this time to repair the sagging ceiling in the 150-year-old sanctuary, a task complicated by the presence of lead. Due to the urgency of the situation, we've begun the restoration process. However, we must secure \$100,000 before the
