Police/Emergency Management:

Administrative/Personnel:

Mayor and Council received monthly reports from the Municipal Clerk, Tax Collector and Chief Financial Officer.

The Municipal Clerk's report for September 2025 showed a total amount received of \$9,780.91.

The Tax Collector's report for September 2025 showed a total amount received of \$38,669.98.

The Chief Financial Officer provided a Budget to Actual Report Through September 30, 2025.

Council President Giberson reported that everything is running smoothly, and he thanked Clerk Blevin for all of her hard work.

Public Works:

Councilmember Allgeyer reported that the department has been working on building platforms under the benches and over hangs for some of the equipment stored in the yard. They are still mowing and cutting. The County has been notified about the condition of the bridge on Riverside Drive, and they are scheduled to come out and repair it.

They discussed the condition of the pickup truck and that it may not make it through the winter.

Councilmember Turner also mentioned that pictures of the lifeguard stand were sent to him showing the condition. He would like to reach out to some Boy Scouts who are working towards their Eagle Scout Project and see if they could do the stand as their project. They agreed this would be a good idea.

They also discussed the condition of the floating dock located at the boat ramp. Councilmember Turner may have one that he can donate. Council President Giberson said that if we cannot use the dock Councilmember Turner has, this will need to be budgeted for next year. He also said that if any material is needed, he would be happy to donate it.

Recreation:

Councilmember Turner reported that he is still getting a lot of positive feedback about the new courts. During the recent storm he did come out and look, and it looked like they are high enough that they did not get covered. He is also working on submitting a request to the Army Air Guard to have a helicopter at next year's Port Day event.

He also shared that the Duct Tape Boat Regatta was an awesome event, and he thanked Val Kozlowski and everyone else who volunteered their time.

Fire and Ambulance:

Councilmember Hawn reported that it has been a busy month so far. They had a few calls related to the storm over the weekend (10/10/25 - 10/13/25) related to trees falling and also cars needing assistance that stalled out in the flood waters.

He also said that the Fire Department Dinner is coming up on Saturday, October 18th and he asked that everyone come out and support.

Council President Giberson shared how thankful Mayor and Council are for the Fire Department.

- On Saturday, October 4th there was a Sons of the American Revolution celebration at the Monument. They also dedicated the new sign that was placed along Park Avenue, near the beach parking lot, for the cemetery on the hill. About 40 people attended.
